	<p>1830 Christian Hillebrandt brings his cattle into Texas from Louisiana and establishes claim to land near Beaumont.</p>	
	<p>1835 Charles Zanco arrives from Denmark to farm in Harris County. Enters the Alamo Feb. 23, 1836, where he died on March 6.</p>	
	<p>1835 George L. Hammeken, persuaded by Stephen F. Austin, arrives in October from Mexico City as a business agent.</p>	
	<p>1836 Peter Johnson moves his shipping business to Galveston from Mobile, Ala. In 1850, relocates to Indianola and Lamar.</p>	<p>1838 Swen Magnus Swenson sets up business in Brazoria, later in Houston. Acquires plantation near Richmond. Later resides in Austin.</p>
	<p>late 1830s John Edward Henrichson settles near Corpus Christi Bay with his three children. Henrichson was of both Danish and Swedish ancestry.</p>	
<p>1841 Johannes Nordboe is first permanent Norwegian settler in Texas a short distance south of Dallas.</p>		
<p>1845 Johan Reinert Reiersen brings first Norwegian colony to Brownsboro.</p>	<p>late 1840s Danes settle individually, many in the Lower Rio Grande Valley (Family names; Loez, Miller, Bedstrup).</p>	<p>1844 Svante Palm arrives at invitation of nephew S.M. Swenson. Settles in Austin where he serves as Swedish-Norwegian vice consul.</p>
	<p>around 1850 John C. Trube, after working on steamers between Galveston and Houston, establishes mercantile business in Galveston.</p>	<p>1848 25 Swedes arrive at Swenson plantation in Fort Bend County. Resettle just east of Austin.</p>
<p>1854 Cleng Peerson, Canutesons and a few other Norwegian families, who had joined Johannes Nordboe near Dallas in 1849, move on to establish Norse (Bosque County).</p>	<p>early 1850s Christian Dorbrandt serves in Army at Fort Croghan near Burnet. Retires from Army and settles at Marble Falls 1855. Later moves to community of South Gabriel (Burnet County).</p>	
	<p>1853 Lovenskiold family settles in Corpus Christi.</p>	
<p>1855 Johan F.G. Striegler, of both Danish and Norwegian ancestry, settles his family at Rocky Hill (Gillespie County) at the invitation of schoolmate from Denmark, Rasmus Frandsen, who preceded him by a year.</p>		
<p>1872 Several Norwegian families migrate to the Lower Rio Grande Valley from other sections of the United States.</p>	<p>late 1860s Danish families settle in what is now Lee County.</p>	<p>1870s Swedes from other states relocate to Texas at Fort Worth, Dallas, Waco.</p>
<p>1880s Danes settle at Hutto (Williamson County) from other parts of Texas.</p>		<p>1880s S.M. Swenson's massive SMS Ranches bring Swedes to Northwest Texas area including Stamford.</p>
<p>1884 Norwegians found Normanna in Bee County.</p>	<p>around 1890 Danes settle at Stonewall (Gillespie County).</p>	
	<p>1894 Danevang founded in Wharton County.</p>	
<p>1908 Anders Mordt recruits Norwegians from Midwestern states to a Panhandle site he named Olso in Hansford County.</p>	<p>1910s Bentsen family relocates from South Dakota to Lower Rio Grande Valley.</p>
