INSTRUCTIONAL SUGGESTIONS

- 1. FILL IN THE BLANK:** Students will answer the questions on the “All About the Lone Star State” **Student Activity Sheet** using “Texas, the Lone Star State” and “Texas’ Rank Among the United States” in the Texas Almanac.
- 2. STATE PROFILE COLLAGE:** In five small groups, students will use “Texas, the Lone Star State” and “Texas’ Rank Among the United States” to create a **collage reflecting state profile data**. A large outline map of Texas will be divided into five sections and each group will place its information on one section.

 - e. The **southern area** of Texas will contain the collage reflecting data on **your school** population, mascot, types of business in the area, and natural resources in the area.

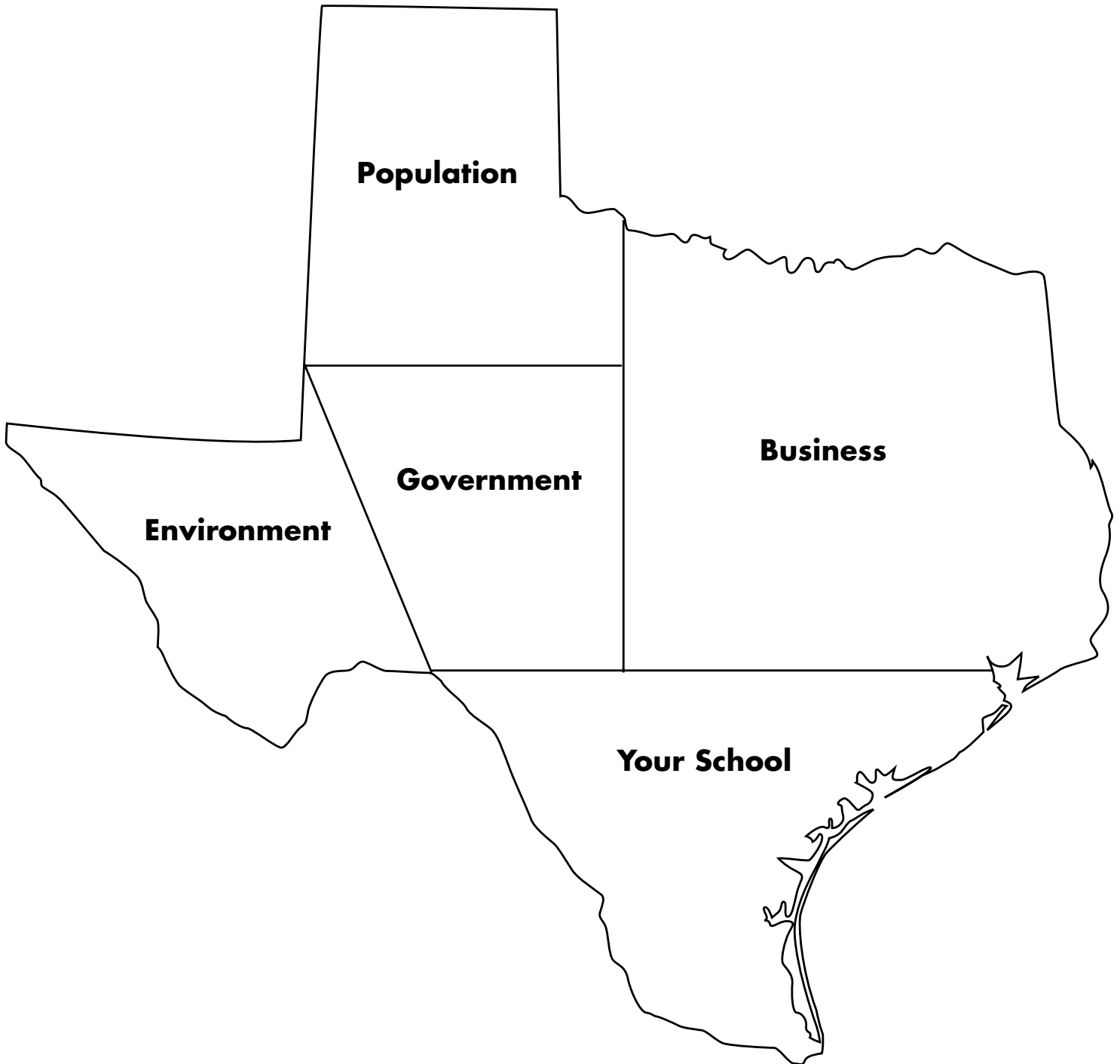
